

Indian Country SP 2024 - Providing Location & Turning in Work

Congratulations! You now know how to use GitHub and write web pages using HTML. There are just two more pieces of information you will need for this project.

Google Form for turning in location data

1. You will be invited to add information for your project using a Google Form.
2. Find the location associated with your project on Google maps
 - a. Hold **Shift** and click on the spot where your site is
 - b. A gray pin will appear on the map and coordinates at the bottom of the page
 - i. click on those coordinates
 - c. A sidebar pops up where you can easily copy and paste the latitude (1st set of numbers) and longitude (2nd set of numbers)
 - d. Fill out the location in the google form
3. Follow the directions on the google form to fill out info for the rest of the pop-up
 - a. **<h3>project-name</h3>** - the name of your project
 - b. **<h4>community</h4>** - the community associated with your project
 - c. **introduction** - An introduction to your project that can be read in the pop-up
 - i. *You do not need <p></p> for this section- just write your intro*
 - d. **MORE DETAILS** - the link to your html. Only fill in your project folder and html.

Pull Request for Updating your Repository and Turning in Work.

1. The owner of the repository (partner A) will have to create the new pull request
 - a. In your forked repo on github.com, click **New pull request**. Should be:
 - i. Base fork: msu anthro/indian-country-ss24 base: main <- head fork: student/indian-country-ss24 compare: main
 - *Reverse the order to pull changes onto your repository*
 - b. Click Create pull request
 - i. Can edit/add a summary and description if you want.
 - *[Troubleshoot: if you committed to master in desktop client twice then you might have to summarize/describe both commits]*
 - c. Click **Create pull request** again
 - d. A yellow box appears while it's creating the request which then turns green if the branch/request has no conflicts
 - i. *| Troubleshoot: If there are conflicts, don't worry – work is still turned in and I can go in and try to locate the issues |*
2. The LEADR GA will approve the pull request and merge the repositories
